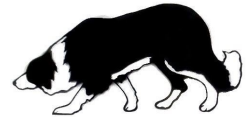

# AGILITY AND TREIBBALL Class Descriptions

## **Foundation Skills for Agility:**

This class will prepare dogs with basic obedience skills for agility classes. Emphasis is on teaching dogs body awareness, drive, directional skills, and confidence using games and some fun equipment. This is a great course to prepare young dogs for an agility career. It will be taught in the Agility Center and will introduce some of the equipment along with foundations skills. Dogs must have good obedience control on and off leash and be non aggressive. **(Prerequisite for this class is the Perfecting Skills class, see Obedience Schedule)**

**Novice Agility:** This is for dogs who have completed the Foundation Skills for Agility and exposed to all the equipment. Dogs will continue their understanding of weave poles and contacts . Also Novice level sequences will be taught with the goal of running a Novice level course.

**Agility Sequences:** Handlers and dogs will work on short sequences within a course. We are offering Open/Excellent or Premier/Masters sequences. Dogs must be able to work off leash and know all the equipment.

## **Agility Competition: Novice/Open**

This class is for dogs that have a good foundation on all equipment and are competing (or preparing to compete) in Novice or Open. Participants will work on handling difficult sequences and challenges and improve handling strategies and techniques.

## **Competition Agility: Excellent/Masters**

This competition-level class is geared towards handlers that are competing with their dogs in Excellent or Masters. Participants will work on handling difficult sequences and challenges, improve handling strategies and techniques, and practice Premier-level skills.

## **TREIBBALL FOUNDATION**

**Treibball is a great dog sport which started in Germany and is suitable for all breeds. The goal is for handler and dog to work as a team to direct the dog from a distance to a formation of balls and push them into a goal. Come and learn more about this dog sport and how you can work towards titles. Dogs must have obedience skills, be able to work on a loose leash, able to sit , down, stay and come when called. No aggressive / reaction dogs allowed.**
